


Wade has degrees from

Information about the Ashram

What is a Christian Ashram

The word Ashram (pronounced "Ah'Shrum) is from the Sanskrit meaning "a retreat", or more literally "away from hard work". It is a time for spiritual growth, proclaiming **Jesus as Lord**. Dr. E. Stanley Jones, a world-famous missionary, evangelist and author, brought the Ashram movement to the United States from India. This quest to make God more real in one's daily living is Christ -centered, church-centered, and person-centered.

Program Highlights

In order to make our Ashram a heart warming, mountaintop experience, time is set aside for worship, sharing, silent meditation, prayer, relaxation and fellowship. The Ashram is interdenominational with a goal of removing all barriers in Christ by providing fresh insight, commitments, and spiritual growth. Classes and activities are available for children and youth through the entire Ashram. Nursery care will also be provided.

Open and Overflowing Heart

The Ashram begins with the sharing of blessings, needs, and spiritual desires that they have coming into the Ashram. It then ends with sharing how each one has been blessed, challenged, and equipped for continuing growth and ministry during the retreat. This special time of praise to God and encouragement of one another prepares us all to return to our lives ready for what God has for us to do.

Speakers

Each Ashram has an Evangelist and a Bible Teacher. The Evangelist helps opens participants hearts God's Spirit with dynamic, bold, and relevant messages in their proclamation of the Word. The Bible Teacher provides substantive, Scripture-based lessons for reflection and discussion.

Healing and Wholeness

Often a pivotal moment during the retreat, each Ashram includes a time when participants are given the opportunity to receive physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual healing through prayer and community support.

24-Hour Prayer Vigil

The Prayer Vigil is a very important discipline of the Ashram. We will observe a 24-hour Prayer Vigil beginning at 10:00 PM Thursday night and continuing until 7:00 AM Sunday morning. A room is designated as our Prayer Room, and a sign-ups will be at the registration table. A journal for recording prayer requests, a Bible, and other devotional materials will be available.

Corporate Silence

The Corporate Silence is another important discipline of the Ashram. We observe Corporate Silence from 11:00 PM each night until the Evangelist breaks the silence at the Corporate Devotional the following morning. During the observed silence, all attendees are ask to refrain from talking.

Scholarships

A limited amount of scholarship funding may be available from the Ralph Green-Bill Osbourne Memorial Scholarship Fund. The primary purpose of a scholarship is to defray the cost for those attending the Ashram for the first time.
